
## Some remarks – not a summary


- There are greater risks of nuclear war today than probably any other moment in the past.
- Public perception of the risk and possible consequences seems to be completely inadequate
- New technologies such as AI can increase rather than decrease risks
- The continuous deterioration of international relationships and reduction of communication lines is making the situation much worse
- Many of the treaties that were put in place on the road of nuclear disarmament are not really working
- There is a huge gap between hopes (e.g. TPNW) and reality (no shared document from NPT revision conference)



#### Resolution of conflicts

- Hope: war should never be used in the resolution of conflicts
- Reality: we have many ongoing wars, most of them in areas which we (westerners) do not care so much about.

- Russia-Ukraine war is worrisome because:
  - Much closer to us
  - On a vast scale
  - Threat of using nuclear weapons









### Perception

- There exist very different and divisive perceptions and perspectives on the Russia-Ukraine war.
  - Ranging from identifying Putin has the sole culprit to laying all responsibilities on western expansionism.
- Radicalization of the conflict represents a huge danger because it closes communication lines and leaves no option other than fighting harder and harder.
  - Possibly escalating the war up to the use of nuclear weapons
- It should always be remembered that in conflicts there are at least two sides and the perception is by definition very different on each side.
  - Double-standards are very often applied to assign responsibilities
  - Seeking good-faith negotiated solutions to conflicts is only only way forward





#### The role of USPID

- Difficult to provide specific recipes.
- Keep exploring possible solutions and inform the public and the policy-makers of the current issues and risks
- Continue pushing for diplomacy and negotiated solutions of conflicts, remembering that "inclusion, dialogue, respect and ojectivity" must be included in policies and negotiations in the Pugwash spirit.
- We should keep trying to make our politicians more aware, informed, and reactive
- A nuclear war cannot be won and should never be fought.





Professor Albert Einstein was asked by friends at a recent dinner party what new weapons might be employed in World War III. Appalled at the implications, he shook his head.

After several minutes of meditation, he said. "I don't know what weapons might be used in World War III. But there isn't any doubt what weapons will be used in World War IV."

"And what are those?" a guest asked.

"Stone spears," said Einstein.


